
WRITING TIPS FROM LINDA BAILEY



- Read the kind of story that you want to write. Read lots of those stories! See what other writers have done. Look for inspiration and techniques to write a story that is completely your own.
- Try to get "inside" your important characters. Imagine that you actually are that character. How do you feel? What do you want? What do you care about?
- Take time to daydream.

 Focus on your story, but allow your mind to
 wander too. Try daydreaming just before you

wander too. Try daydreaming just before you go to sleep or just after you wake up. Your imagination may be especially active then.
