
ALBERT'S QUIETQUEST

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HOW TO GET STARTED

- **1.** Decide on the date, time, duration, place and theme of your reading party.
 - If you can't host at home, encourage your school, local bookstore or library to help.
 - Themes can be anything, from books featuring beaches or cats to spooky books to picture books or graphic novels to books by local authors!
 - Create a suggested reading list based on your theme.
- 2. Invite friends and family to join you.
- **3.** Create posters about the reading party to help spread the word. You can even make more decorations like banners or bunting. We've included the beach scene that Albert uses to find his peace, print and frame it to get started!

- **4.** Make sure there are comfortable chairs, pillows or blankets for people to read on.
- **5.** If you'd like, have a snack and drink station set up for people to fuel up on. We recommend softer foods that don't make loud crunches when people are reading quietly.
- **6.** When everyone has arrived, be sure to thank them for participating. Then, at the appointed time, set the clock and read!
