


Keep the Conversation Going

Here are some ideas, activities and questions to consider after you've read the book:

- Go for a walk around your neighborhood and see how many animals you can spot. Can you find any evidence that there was recently a creature nearby (paw prints, bites out of leaves, holes in the ground, etc.)?
- What kind of evidence do you think fairies would leave behind if they lived near you?



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Activity

What you'll need:

- A Y-shaped stick or branch
- Scissors
- Colored pencils, crayons or paint

Create a design and color in the butterfly.

- 1. With the help of an adult, cut the butterfly out. Fold it in half (along the dotted line) and cut along the horizontal lines.
- 2. Take your Y-shaped stick, and gently shimmy the straight end through the slots until you reach the Y, which is now your butterfly's antenna.
- 3. Flutter, and enjoy!
